Rev Jane Thompson writes:

Summer is here and, as I write, so is the sun! While sadly the Covid case numbers are rising, so much else seems really positive: weddings and baptisms are back, 8am services at Farley and Michelmersh have resumed, we are planning for an altogether Benefice Tea AND TOM IS ARRIVING! In fact by the time you read this Tom and Maryanne will be moved in and his collation, licensing and induction service will be imminent, if not already happened.

It has been an extraordinary two years, nothing that any of us could have envisaged, or indeed would have wanted to. However, we have pulled together, supported one another and, ably led by our church wardens, have not just survived but grown together as a Benefice. It seems to me that we have a greater understanding of one another and with that better understanding comes an appreciation of our differences; this new perspective, this new understanding, this deepening maturity in our faith, stands us in really good stead as we open the next chapter in our life together as a Benefice.

Welcoming our new Rector, Revd Tom Benson

We are delighted that Tom will be licensed on Thursday 29th July at St Mary's Michelmersh as Rector of our 5 parishes and Priest-in-Charge of Somborne with Ashley.

Many are unaware that King's Somborne has been in a 'group' with us for several years, and that it was agreed when that arrangement was made that Canon Steve Pittis' successor would become Priest-in-Charge, a role held in the interim by the Area Dean Revd James Pitkin. The Revd Richard Burningham remains as resident part-time House-for-Duty priest in the parish of Somborne with Ashley. And of course, Revd Jane Thompson remains as Assocate Priest in our benefice. Tom, Jane and Richard are each licensed to work in all 6 parishes of the group as need arises. So the service on Thursday 29th will be graced by the presence of 12 churchwardens!

Prayer Spaces for Schools

One Monday afternoon in July, just after home-time, Mary and I arrived at Awbridge School, excited to set up for our annual day of Prayer Spaces for the year 6s. We were excited, and a little daunted, since, with the everchanging regulations, a lot of the planning had to be done in a very short space of time. The biggest new challenge was that, under COVID, all the inside spaces were being used as class rooms – so we were to be outside! The outdoor class room was great and, as Tuesday turned out to be filled with gusting wind and very heavy rain showers, the All Saints gazebo proved invaluable in extending our outdoor space! Despite all the challenges Mary created some wonderfully inspired spaces for the children to use to help them pause and reflect as they begin to prepare for the big leap to secondary school in September.

Tuesday morning we arrived early to set up and then during registration popped into class to give a short introduction. After that it was full steam ahead! Through the day four groups each of five or six children came and enjoyed an hour of calm away from the frenzied end of year 6 activities.



They started by watching the "calming jar" as the sparkling contents settled, after which they moved round each prayer space taking as much time as they wanted. The "transition bunting" gave the opportunity to reflect on all they have loved about their time at primary school, the things they are looking forward to next year, as well as the things they are apprehensive about. By

dropping a fizzy tablet into a jug of water and watching it dissolve, there was time to let go of the things that had hurt them.

The "Togetherness" jigsaw had a blank piece of jigsaw for each of them to draw a picture of themselves on. Once completed and assembled it made up a wonderful memento of all the Awbridge School leavers 2021. The jigsaw was coupled with "Uniqueness", where finger tips were pressed on coloured ink pads and then on paper, to then be turned into people, using the finger print as the body and drawing on hair and limbs – we are all completely unique! On cut-out coloured tear drops they wrote things that

had made them sad this year, and on clouds they were encouraged to think big dreams for the future.



As we were set up in the corner of the school field by the pond, we were surrounded by the beauty of creation - so one station had leaves to select, stick and note observations and another had coloured chalk for drawing. The time they had with us provided space to pause and observe the beauty of creation,

which they may not have really noticed before. Each group finished their session with the bubble machine churning multicoloured bubbles up into the sky. The children laughed and played before returning relaxed and refreshed to class for the rest of the day.



We had a real sense of God with us, of peace and of calm, despite the weather and the rushing around of children from other year groups. It was a wonderful day for us, hugely supported by the head teacher and especially the lovely year 5 and year 6 teachers. Paula, year 5 teacher and RE co-ordinator, wrote on behalf of the year 6's and their teacher Chloe, "A HUGE 'thank you' to you all, for all your preparation

and time with Prayer Spaces last week. The Year 6 children have been buzzing with the day since and it was incredibly important that they had that time and space to reflect on their lives and transition to their next school." We have an open invite to return next year!

Did you know you can now contact the Parish Giving Scheme directly on line? Go to www.parishgiving.org.uk and search in the "find your parish" section. You can set up regular giving, including Gift aid if wished, or if you already belong to the scheme you will be able to set up access to your account so you can check on your donations and alter them as need be. And a reminder to us all, in whatever way we give - if we intend our giving to remain static, rather than decrease, we need to increase it slightly each year - by a few pence in the pound!

Latest news from our Ugandan Link

Bishop Nathan of South Rwenzori is passionate about the environment. He aims to plant trees along every street in Kasese, the largest town in his Diocese.

He has also declared that:-

Every parent in the Diocese who brings a child for baptism should plant a tree either at their home, church, school or nearby public place.

Every Christian coming for confirmation should plant a tree at their home, church or nearby public place and that this must be verified by the Archdeacon 21 days before the confirmation service.

Every congregation shall ensure a piece of land is reserved for tree planting.

Every church founded school/college shall ensure that tree planting is part of the curriculum.

The Romsey Deanery Overseas Partnership Group has been supporting the tree nursery in Kasese for several years. Money is sent to buy seeds for a variety of trees for local plantations including grevillia and pine or fruit trees such as mango which are given to needy families to help provide an income.

The Bishop now intends to set up tree nurseries in each of his 13 Archdeaconries in order to provide the trees needed for all of the above!

This is amazing and surely a project worth supporting both financially and in prayer.

Covid 19 Update. Last month we were invited to join in the South Rwenzori Diocese Day of Prayer as they battled a steep increase in infections. It's good to see that in recent weeks the infection rate has been falling. Of a population of roughly 33,000 in Uganda, just over 3% have received a first vaccine dose - no-one a second one as yet. The statistics show: since the pandemic began, Uganda has recorded 91,355 cases of Covid 19, 2,483 deaths from Covid 19 - and 71,750 people who had the virus have recovered. What a wonderfully positive outlook from a country with so many challenges. We continue to pray for them all.

- We pray for a growing understanding of how we can care for the environment and a deeper commitment to make changes which will make a difference to the lives of those across the world who are most adversely affected by climate change, so evident in the natural disasters of recent weeks

 wisdom to our decisions and unity in all we do.
 Help our churches

 and in love,
